A Special Five-Week Worship Emphasis

Sunday, October 13th, 20th, & 27th, and November 3rd & 10th

I am excited to announce a five-week series designed for our church to invite our friends who don't have a church home. On these five weeks, I will be preaching from one of the most important parts of the New Testament, Luke 15, where Jesus tells us that his Father runs after those who have turned their back on Him; and when they come back to Him, he throws a party! There can be no better time of the year for you to invite someone to come with you to church!

Many times the church gets it all wrong! We think the church exists to serve us and meet our spiritual needs. That is absolutely WRONG! The church is the place that is meant to be a place where lost find hope! In a world that only cares about itself, we have the opportunity to tell people we care about them because God cares about them. We offer hope and truth and God's love. Bishop Felton May used to refer to the church as a

Another theologian calls the church "a hospital for sinners." We exist to lift Jesus up so that, as Jesus said, "He might draw all humanity unto Himself." One of the things that is amazing to me about Bethany is the way we love one another and make people feel welcome. This is exactly what Jesus said to do in John 13:34-35 (NIV), "³⁴A new command I give You: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. ³⁵By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." Others won't come to Jesus because of our fancy building, our denominational affiliation, our ease of parking...no...Jesus says that they will notice how we love one another! So let's take Jesus at His word! We love others because of God's love for us and that same divine love exists for those who don't even know it yet!

So then I am asking, if you love Jesus, for you to commit to these three things:

- 1. Commit to pray every day for those who do not have a Jesus Family to come these five weeks.
- 2. Begin inviting people! Tell them about this special emphasis—tell them you are sharing this with them because you care about them—invite, plead, pester, bribe, offer rides, promise to take them out for lunch, do whatever you have to do to get them to church; and I promise to present the good news of Jesus in a powerful and unmistakable way!
- 3. Commit to not missing a single Sunday during this special five-week emphasis. Change your vacations, cancel your plans away, so that you can help energize our worship space!


Let's welcome an entire new group of sisters and brothers into the Kingdom of God in Jesus' name!






Online Sunday Morning Worship


In addition to in-person worship, we are also providing two streams to watch online services, both live and archived. All online watching happens through our website. For further information, please contact Pastor Don.

Susquehanna Conference News



The Rev. Héctor A. Burgos-Núñez was elected Bishop on November 4, 2022, at the Northeastern Jurisdictional Conference of The United Methodist Church. He is the first Hispanic-Latino bishop in the Northeastern Jurisdiction and the first Puerto Rican bishop in The United Methodist Church.

He has been serving the Upper New York Area since January 1, 2023.

Bishop Héctor A. Burgos-Núñez holds a M.Div. from the School of Theology at Drew University in Madison, NJ; a bachelor's in business administration with a concentration in Management and Strategic Marketing from the University of Puerto Rico; and a graduate certificate in Information Systems Technology. At the time of his election to the episcopacy, Bishop Burgos-Núñez was serving as District Superintendent of the Central District of the Greater New Jersey Conference.

Bishop Burgos-Núñez served pastorates at West Creek United Methodist Church 2004 - 2005; First United Methodist Church, Iglesia Casa de Esperanza 2005 - 2009; and Oasis United Methodist Church 2009 - 2014. He also served as Director of Worship and Urban Ministries 2014, Executive Director of NextGen Ministries of GNJ 2016-2018, and Director of Connectional Ministries 2015 - 2019 for the Greater New Jersey Conference.

Bishop Burgos-Núñez is a Community Leadership Fellow from the Lewis Center for Church Leadership, a certified ICA coach, and an Outward Mindset facilitator. He also served as Director of Communications for MARCHA, the National Hispanic/Latino caucus within the United Methodist Church, from 2010 - 2022.

Bishop Burgos-Núñez's interests include racial and organizational equity, leadership development, contextual evangelism and worship, and strategic communications in a digital era. He finds joy in cooking for his family and friends and is known for his famous meat marinades and BBQ ribs. Bishop Burgos-Núñez also enjoys blogging. His blog, Mensajes de Esperanza has more than 150,000 followers throughout Latin America. He shares life with his wife, Jazelis Adorno, and their children, Fabián, Joel, Marcos, and Valeria.




GriefShare Tuesdays @ 6:30 PM in the Social Hall Annex


Everyday Disciple -Being Like Jesus in Everyday Life Bible Study with Pastor Don

This Bible Study will explore the ways in which we share the gospel, facilitate conversation, and foster discipleship as individuals and the church.


Women's Bible Study The Well-Watered Woman

What is a Nurse Honor Guard? The Honor Guard pays tribute to nurses after their death by providing the Nightingale tribute at their funeral or memorial service. This service is similar to a military tribute and officially releases the nurse from their nursing duties. The Nurse Honor Guard dresses in the traditional white uniform complete with cap and cape. The ceremony is brief; it takes about five minutes and consists of reciting the Nightingale tribute and laying of a white rose on the casket or next to the urn, symbolizing the nurse's dedication to the profession. After the Nightingale tribute is recited, a triangle is rung after roll call for the nurse. The nurse's name is called three times, and the triangle is rung after each call of the name. After the roll call, the words are spoken and the nurse is officially released from their nursing duties. A lit Nightingale lamp is carried up at the beginning of the ceremony and is then

extinguished and presented to the family with personal condolences made. The Honor Guard recently attended a funeral here at Bethany for our own Linda Clement. It was a very moving ceremony. Our own Valerie Hardy-Sprenkle is part of the Honor Guard. 


How can I use Google Pay?

3. Click the button that says **GPay**, and a pop-up window will appear allowing you to select which saved

card you'd like to use for this transaction.

4. Once you've selected your card, click **CONTINUE** to complete your gift or payment.

Keep in mind, that Google Pay will appear blank if you've not already added payment methods. If you decide you'd rather not pay with Google Pay, simply close out the pop-up window and select a different payment method on the giving or registration form.
