Life is hard enough without extra drama. Most of the time, the drama we deal with is of our own creating or someone else creating. But sometimes, God creates drama so that His work can be done.

Listen again to Matthew's telling of the Christmas story....

Matthew 1:18-25 (NIV 1984) ¹⁸ This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want

to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly. ²⁰ But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." ²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: ²³ "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel"—which means, "God with us." ²⁴ When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. ²⁵ But he had no union with her until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.

I would venture a guess that when Joseph found out that Mary was pregnant, that one of his thoughts was, "I didn't sign up for this drama."

For Mary's part, she, also, must have shared a similar thought, "I didn't sign up for the drama that this baby is going to create."

Joseph sought to do right by Mary and not put her through any extra drama. But after having a dream, Joseph is assured that the drama they are both facing is not of Mary's creating but of the Holy Spirit.

Holidays, lost loved ones, family fights, rising inflation, gas prices, who needs the drama? I want to encourage you as we prepare for Christmas, that joy counters drama. The joy of a promised fulfilled. The joy of a new life. The joy of a savior who will save HIS people. The joy of God with us.

Many times, it is in the midst of the drama, that we become more open to God breaking into our reality and shaking things up. Joseph had a plan, quiet carpenter life in Nazareth. Mary had a plan, quiet life with Joseph in Nazareth. Neither of them pictured the drama ahead of an unplanned pregnancy, delivery in a stable, visits from angels, shepherd worshipers, kingly gifts, slaughter of innocent babies, running for their new born's life to a foreign country. But in the midst of all this drama, God was with them. God provided for them. God protected them. God delivered them. God reminded them that He was all that they needed. Their baby already knew that.

This Christmas season, I don't pretend to know the drama that you face. Some may be self-created, but others may be God created. Whichever is the case, hold tight to the joy that God is with you. God will provide. God will protect. God will deliver. Jesus is exactly what we needed and He is exactly what this world needs. Amen.








"The Silent Night — Blue Christmas"






Online Sunday Morning Worship





Wednesdays @ 6:30 PM in the Sanctuary





Wednesdays @ 6:30 PM in the Contemporary Worship Area Coffee Corner Begins December 11th



Advent Colors — One of the season's symbolic colors is blue, representing hope. During Advent, we wait in hope to celebrate again God's coming in human form. We also look forward in hope to christ's coming in glory at the end of the age. Purple symbolizes the royalty of Jesus, the coming Prince of Peace, and the penitence with which we receive him. Some congregations also use pink or white candles in Advent wreaths, with pink symbolizing joy and white symbolizing the Christ Child.



Friends at Bethany, This morning, October 28, 2024, my church group said a prayer of Thanksgiving, particularly for the people God has put around us—people who care for others and show us how. Near noon, I visited Zach at the nursing home. Many times, Zach has very little to say. Today was better. He said "Hi, Cecil" when I entered, and he said "No, thank you" when I offered to bring Orange Gatorade from my car. When awake, Zach looks around a lot without much extended gaze

except at his silent TV. He has a bit of trouble staying dressed and keeping the bedclothes on his bed. His sweet nurse, Salina, says that he ate breakfast, but only because she fed it to him. Another nurse came in and said that Zach was to get a shower today. As I saw the care from the nurses—God again focused me on my earlier gratitude filled prayer. In the 20 minutes before Zach's shower, I opened the package that Bethany Church sent. I saw the hand-made blue letter holder and placed his hand on the cross. I told him that the cross reminds me how much that Jesus has cared for Zach and that the letters inside the carrier also show care from the people at Zach's church back in PA. Once again, I praise God for showing me people who care for others and help me to learn. I couldn't keep my voice bold, but I read the letters aloud. Zach nodded several times when I asked if he recognized the signature names. I read the introduction, a couple of prayers, and the first chapter from the book that you sent ("This, Too, Shall Pass"). Recently, I have read some academic articles on the associated topic of pain and trials. I think of God's power to "refine" us, in his service, through trials. God has been using our care for Zach in just exactly that way. Referring to 1 Peter 6:7 and the chapter context, the result is "praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ." Simply put, Bethany Church, Thanks for the caring that you have shown. Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow. -Cecil Stuerke
