The month of February is full of possibilities. All kinds of things are anticipated. Groundhog Day has always fascinated me. The cold and snow of December and January start to wear on our minds, and we long for the freshness of spring. We look to a rodent to find potential hope of warmer days ahead. Groundhog Day can be a fun distraction, but as a pastor, you know I am going to point you to look at Jesus as your source of hope!

With Jesus as our source of hope, we need to focus on our role as disciples. In that role, we tend to focus on following Jesus, living according to His teachings. The role that receives less focus, though, is our role to make other disciples. That may sound daunting, but it really isn't. As we saw back in October and November, making disciples really is nothing more than caring for people because Jesus cares for them! When people know we care, we then can invite!

For the month of February, we will be focusing on our mission as a church: To believe, to belong, and to become!

- We **believe** in Jesus that means we conform our lives to His teachings. Conforming our lives to Jesus is what will make us different from the world and make us worthy of being noticed by the world!
- We **belong** to one another in Jesus that means we do life together. We serve one another, we care for one another, we laugh or cry with one another, all guided by the Holy Spirit. Jesus said that the rest of the world would notice us and know that we were His disciples by the way we love each other! The way we belong/love one another is what makes us worthy of being noticed by the rest of the world.
- Lastly, we **become** more like Jesus our goal is to look less like this world and more like Jesus. As Paul writes in Romans, we no longer conform to this world but are transformed by changing our thinking/living like Jesus! The world has plenty of examples of pain, jealousy, greed, etc. The world needs to see examples of truth, hope, joy, forgiveness, patience,

peace, kindness, gentleness, and self-control

in us!

This is our February faith journey together. Please make being in worship and inviting others to worship a top priority so that we can believe, belong, and become!




Valentines for Kids


Everyday Disciple – Being Like Jesus in Everyday Life Bible Study with Pastor Don





Every life gets messy at times. Sometimes these messes are literal, like a house that would be easier to condemn than to clean. But sometimes they are intangible messes such as illness, conflict, depression, abuse, bankruptcy, divorce, and job loss. And these messes can be painful, hurting our hearts and our homes. But as we see in the Bible, God loves to use messy people! We will dig into the

lives of biblical heroes who were messy people just like us but who were used by God in powerful ways. Together we will examine the stories of five wonderful but messy people and one messy parable character: Rahab, the Prodigal Son, Josiah, Mary, David, and Daniel. From their stories, we will learn how God can use broken people, restore damaged hearts and relationships, give us power to handle our critics, and help us deal with the hard moments of life. Along the way, we'll discover that we don't have to just endure messy lives but can actually learn to thrive with God's guidance and help. It guides us toward new healthy truths and life-giving habits as we repair our broken relationships. Join more than seven million hurting people across the globe who now walk in freedom through the power of Jesus Christ as we walk through the eight principles of Celebrate Recovery based on the Beatitudes in Matthew 5. These are some of the issues people find freedom from in Celebrate Recovery: Anger ~ Codependency ~ Eating Disorder ~ Love & Relationship Addiction ~ Physical, Sexual, and/or Emotional Abuse ~ Drug Addiction ~ Alcoholism ~ Sexual Addiction ~ Gambling Addiction ~ Grief ~ Mental Health ~ and many other issues we may struggle with.

For the past several years, Pastor Stephany has been found at the helm of decorated themed trees and enjoys her team of decorators. 2024's Festival of Trees event featured 31 beautifully decorated trees that all told a story of York's history.
