My Dear Bethany Family,

From the Pastor

By now, most of you know that come July 1, 2026, I will be appointed by the Bishop as a Conference Superintendent. This means I will be the spiritual leader and chief missional strategist for the River Valley District in cooperation with the Bishop and Cabinets of Upper New York and Susquehanna Conference.

That's a super fancy title or job description. In the next few months as I transition from being your Pastor into that new position, please realize that I never sought this position. I was

thankful and fulfilled to be your pastor. When I tell you at the end of worship that I love you, those are not just words, they are heartfelt emotions. My initial reaction was that of the biblical story of Jonah, I wanted to run the opposite way of God's calling. But knowing full well that there is no peace apart from God and obedience to God, I submitted my will to His. I now hold on to the biblical story of Esther and hold to the promise that God has a plan "for such a time as this."

It is easy when we "do not know" for the enemy to sidetrack our thinking. The "what ifs" seek only to introduce fear and doubt. Let me remind you of what we have learned together over the last two and half years.

As disciples, we need to strive and encourage one another to keep the main thing the main thing. At the heart of our faith is not a program, a preference, or even a pastor—it is at the person of Jesus! It's all about Jesus. Discipleship begins and ends with us following Him, trusting that God is on the throne and that His love is stronger than anything that threatens to shake us. Scripture tells us that we "know and rely on the love God has for us," and that "perfect love casts out fear." When we remember who God is—faithful, sovereign, unchanging—we find the courage to live with obedience. God wants us to take courage, not because life is easy but because His love is steady and His presence is sure. Loving Jesus and following Jesus is a love that always moves us outward: "Whoever loves God must also love his brother." So, as we walk through our days, our decisions, and our relationships, we return again to the center—trusting God, following Jesus, and letting His love shape how we think and how we live. When we keep the main thing the main thing, fear loses its grip, love takes the lead, and our lives begin to look more like Jesus.

This is our calling; this is our purpose.

Know that I love you, know that as you hurt, I hurt because you are hurting. Let us both hold to God's promises, the Truth, Jesus!


SUNDAY WORSHIP SNOW POLICY



A natural talent for capturing York landmarks

"He's never had an art lesson in his life," Carol Myers says of her husband, Jay.

Sitting in the dining room of their rural home — with more than a dozen Christmas cards he painted spread out on the table in front of him — that seems almost impossible.

But it is not. Jay is a born artist who has been drawing since the time he started elementary school. When he was 17, Jay entered an oil painting in the York Fair. It won a first-place ribbon.

After graduating from Red Lion Area High School, Jay began his career in the printing business and eventually went to work for York Tape and Label Co. (later York Label and now Multi-Color Corporation) becoming the

company's supervisor of art and composition.

Beginning in 1984, the company asked Jay to create a holiday card to send out to customers. "The first one was of the Golden Plough Tavern and Gates House," on the corner of Market Street and Pershing Avenue, Jay says.

Fourteen more scenes followed over the years to be featured on the company's annual cards. The subjects included the Colonial Court House, St. John's Episcopal Church, Codorus Furnace, the York County Courthouse (now Administrative Center), Federal-style homes on East Market Street and Queen Anne-style homes on South George Street, the Elmwood Mansion, First Presbyterian Church, the Kin Mar Estate in West Manchester Township, the Billmeyer House, Central Market, the Cookes House, the Willis House, and the Rex and Laurel firehouses.

The original, realistic-style paintings were created in oils on 16-by-20-inch canvas. For the cards, four-color separations were created and printed on 4½ by 5½-inch labels (appropriate for the company) and then the labels were affixed to the greeting cards.

"His paintings are very detailed," Carol says. That takes a lot of patience, right? "I don't have patience," Jay interjects, "but I like to paint."

Each work "takes about 200 hours," he adds.

Since Jay retired after 41 years with the company in 2006 and Carol retired as a secretary from Bell Socialization Services, the couple have made many trips to other states and countries. Jay has captured many of these travels on film and then painted them on canvas. He has also created a series of Christmas themes on pieces of slate.


Jay's most recent work is of the Rehmeyer Hollow home, scene of the famous 1928 "Hex Murder," which is not too far from his own home. "I had been shown a photograph of the home with police cars in front of it taken the day Nelson Rehmeyer's body was found," he said. He made a copy of the photograph and then did an oil painting that now hangs in the family dining room.

In fact, just about every wall in the Myers' two-story home has oil or acrylic paintings by Jay. "I like Native American subjects," Jay, 75, says.

Jay has done three paintings of his church, Bethany United Methodist in Red Lion, which are in the church. About 50 years ago, he created a large wall mural for the Red Lion VFW Home of the World War II flag raising on Iwo Jima. And it's still there.

Both Jay and Carol are York County natives. Married for 55 years, they met at the Playland Skating Rink. They have two children: a son, Jade Myers, owns Matrix Art Services, West York; and a daughter, Jody Alwood, is vice president of Leverwood Knife Works, Dallastown.








In addition to in-person worship, we are also providing two streams to watch online services, both live and archived. All online watching happens through our website. For further information, please contact Pastor Don.


The "Connecting People with God" Committee is asking various people in our church what books they have read that have helped them in their walk with God or their understanding of scriptures. Of course, our first recommendation is always the Bible, but we hope you find these others helpful as well. February's Book-of-the-Month is *Our Purpose is Love* by David Field. As Christians, we know we are supposed to love one another, but even that mandate has come to mean different

things to different people. What does it mean to love God and neighbor today—in both the world and the church—and can this be the answer to the conflict that divides and polarizes us? In *Our Purpose is Love*, David Field answers this question with a compelling "Yes!" as he challenges us to recognize and reclaim love as the center of our identity and purpose as the church. Field presents a Wesleyan vision of the church as the embodiment of God's love in the world and explores the implications of this vision for our life together. In this vision, the church is where we become creatures of love, learning to love God and neighbor ever more completely and authentically through the means of God's grace. As a result, we bear witness to the world by reflecting God's love more and more perfectly in the way we treat others and order our common life. With a special focus on the importance of unity for the church's witness, Field invites us to consider the ways in which embodying God's love can and should influence how we live as individuals and as communities of faith, calling us to reclaim and recommit to love as the center of who we are. Men's Bible Study the Book of Romans (concludes February 4th)





Is Celebrate Recovery for me or someone I know?



Missions Committee Update
